



**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 67-C**

Series of 2020

**AN ORDER ESTABLISHING A NUMBER CODING SCHEME TO REGULATE  
VEHICLES IN MANDAUE CITY DURING THE PERIOD OF ENHANCED  
COMMUNITY QUARANTINE**

**WHEREAS**, on March 30, 2020, Mandaue City was placed under a state of Enhanced Community Quarantine in congruence with the entire province of Cebu to prevent the spread of Covid-19 virus;

**WHEREAS**, there is an urgent necessity to limit the number of vehicles plying the city streets and public roads in order to minimize persons from going around the City during the Enhanced Community Quarantine as a way to prevent the further transmission of COVID-19;

**WHEREAS**, under Section 455 (b) (1) (vii) of Republic Act No. 7160, the Local Government Code of 1991, the City Mayor is empowered carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary during natural disasters and calamities;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, JONAS C. CORTES**, Mayor of Mandaue City, and by the virtue of the powers and authority vested in me by law, and congruent with my previous executive orders, do hereby order the establishment of a number coding scheme to regulate vehicles in the city during the period of enhanced community quarantine and order that:

**SECTION 1. COVERAGE.** This Order shall apply to all motor vehicles including motorcycles using public roads, streets and thoroughfares within the territorial jurisdiction of Mandaue City, unless otherwise provided herein.

**SECTION 2. NUMBER CODING SCHEME.** Only the following motor vehicles including motorcycles shall be allowed to use public roads, streets and thoroughfares within the territorial jurisdiction of Mandaue City on the followings days:

Ending in 1-3-5-7-9 (odd number)	Mondays
Ending in 2-4-6-8-0 (even number & zero)	Tuesdays
Ending in 1-3-5-7-9 (odd number)	Wednesdays
Ending in 2-4-6-8-0 (even number & zero)	Thursdays
Ending in 1-3-5-7-9 (odd number)	Fridays
Ending in 2-4-6-8-0 (even number & zero)	Saturdays



Ending in 1-3-5-7-9 (odd number)	Sunday ( 12:00 am to 11:59 am)
Ending in 2-4-6-8-0 (even number & zero)	Sunday ( 12:00 pm to 11:59 pm)

**SECTION 3. EXEMPTIONS.** The following motor vehicles and/or motorcycles are exempted from this Order:

1. Ambulances, fire trucks, police cars, military vehicles or other law enforcement owned/registered vehicles/motorcycles on official functions;
2. Those hired/used/authorized by the city government for free public transportation, relief operations, delivery of goods or other purposes;
3. Those carrying person/s needing immediate medical attention;
4. Diplomatic vehicles with diplomatic plates;
5. Those owned/registered by any of the barangays in Mandaue City with appropriate government plates or markings expressly showing the name of the barangay on official functions;
6. Those owned/operated/used by:

**6.1 The following as exempted by Section 4 (4) of Executive Order No. 67 series of 2020:**

- a) Farmers, fishermen, agri-business, and other food producers or suppliers;
- b) Persons involved in medical services such as health workers, Red Cross Staff, doctors, clinic personnel, hospital staff, employees and janitors of medical centers and private caregivers;
- c) Pharmacists and employees of Pharmacies;
- d) Persons involved in funeral services and immediate family of the deceased;
- e) Emergency Responders;
- f) Law Enforcers and authorized security service personnel;
- g) Bank employees, technical service support crew of banks and armored vehicle crew;
- h) Money Transfer Service employees;
- i) Groceries and Convenience Store employees;
- j) Laundry Shop Employees;
- k) Electric Power Generation, Transmission and Distribution Employees;





- l) Petroleum Tanker Drivers;
- m) Gasoline Station Attendants;
- n) Water Companies Officials and Employees;
- o) Water Delivery and Refilling Stations Crew;
- p) Garbage Collectors and Sanitation or Waste Management providers;
- q) Public Market Vendors;
- r) Bakery workers;
- s) Food Chain / Restaurant Staff and Crew;
- t) Delivery Personnel of Cargoes – with or without load;
- u) Employees working at food and medical manufacturing establishments;
- v) Forwarders, Shipping Lines, and Container Yards;
- w) Logistics/ Warehouse establishments employees;
- x) Telecommunications Officials and Employees;
- y) Employees of Cable and Internet Service Providers;
- z) Government Skeletal force;
- aa) Judges of Regional Trial Courts, Municipal Trial Courts, Prosecutors, Public Attorneys, Clerks of Courts and their employees;
- bb) Members of the Media with valid identification;
- cc) Employees of Business Process Outsourcing and Export-oriented Business;
- dd) Heads of Missions or Designated Foreign Mission Representatives (including limited foreign mission personnel and staff);
- ee) Hotel employees who have existing long term leases and booking accommodations as of March 25, 2020 or until the final client has checked-out;
- ff) Outbound international passengers and driver;
- gg) Civil Aviation Related Services Personnel;
- hh) Construction and related services;
- ii) Mail, courier, freight and shipping services;
- jj) Services necessary to maintain the safety, sanitation, and essential operations of residences;

7. Those which may be authorized by the City Mayor or his duly authorized representative.

**SECTION 4. MANDATORY REQUIREMENT OF VEHICLES FALLING UNDER THE EXEMPTIONS.** Should the vehicle or motorcycle fall under any of the exemptions under Section 3, the owner and/or driver must post a written inscription of the purpose of the transport and under which agency or institution the purpose of the transport in a conspicuous part of the vehicle/motorcycle. Further, the driver must present a company ID/personal identification card or business permit/documents proving the exemption of such person/company and shall submit the goods/cargoes transported to physical examination at the checkpoints.



Failure to comply the aforesaid requirements under this section shall be a ground to disallow passage of the vehicle/motorcycle.

**SECTION 5. CONSTRUCTION.** Any doubt whether or not the said vehicle/motorcycle falls under any of the exemptions shall be construed against the exemption.

**SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT.** The Traffic Enforcement Agency of Mandaue (TEAM) with the assistance of the Mandaue City Police Office (MCPO) and other law enforcement offices/agencies, as the case may be, are hereby mandated to strictly enforce this Order and in consequence thereto, apprehend, imposed fine and/or file appropriate charges, complaints or cases against any violators pursuant to existing laws, ordinances or rules.


**SECTION 7. SEPARABILITY.** Should any provision of this Order be declared invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions not otherwise affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 8. REPEALING.** Any and all executive orders, issuances, rules and regulations, memoranda of the City of Mandaue or any part thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 9. EFFECTIVITY.** This Executive Order shall take effect on **12:00 am of April 20, 2020** and shall remain effective during the effectivity of the enhanced community quarantine unless sooner revoked or suspended.
